# Information for Incoming Students 2023/24

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## Preliminary note

The aim of this document is to provide an overview of application procedures and program options for students planning a study stay at the Medical University of Vienna (MedUni Vienna).

The general **prerequisites** for a 2- to 12-month stay at MedUni Vienna in the framework of the Erasmus+ SMS Program / SEMP (student mobility for studies) are:

- A **bilateral cooperation agreement** between the applicant’s home university and Medical University of Vienna is in place.
- The applicant **remains enrolled at their home university** for the duration of their stay at MedUni Vienna.
- The applicant has **officially been nominated** by the International Office/responsible department of their home university during the nomination period.
- The applicant can provide proof of **German language proficiency** during the application process (at least CEFR level B1; all curricular courses and exams at MedUni Vienna are held in German)

## Application process

### Step 1: Nomination by home institution

**Nomination period** (for coordinators at partner universities): **April 1<sup>st</sup> to April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023**

**IMPORTANT:** This deadline applies both to stays starting in fall 2023 and spring 2024 (i.e. there is no separate nomination phase for stays in the 2024 spring term)!

The International Office will inform Erasmus+ partner universities regarding the nomination procedure in due course via email.

### Step 2: Application by student

**Application period** (for applicants): **April 1<sup>st</sup> to April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023**

Nominated students will be invited to complete an online application form via the application tool **“Mobility-Online”** (see details on how to complete the form on page 11/12). Access information will be provided via email.

The following table provides an overview of application steps and corresponding due dates:

Submit <b>Erasmus+ / SEMP Learning Agreement</b> (signed by student and home university)	At least four weeks before start of stay*

\* Only once the course program indicated in Mobility Online has been approved by the MUW International Office, the actual “Learning Agreement” should be created accordingly (see page 8).

The Learning Agreement will only be signed on the side of MedUni Vienna if all application steps indicated above have been completed correctly and in due course.

### Step 3: Enrolment at MedUni Vienna

Students whose Learning Agreement has been accepted temporarily will be enrolled at MedUni Vienna for the duration of their stay (winter term 2023/24, academic year 2023/24 or summer term 2024).

In order to complete their enrollment, students need to **transfer the Austrian students' union fee** of currently **22,70 €** (status 2023/24) at least by

- **September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2023** (stays starting in the winter term)
- **February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024** (stays starting in the summer term)

Students will receive details on this obligatory payment via email in due course (at the beginning of the respective enrollment period). If a students' stay extends over two semesters, they will have to transfer the fee for the second semester in due course as well.

## Course options

The information provided on the following pages is relevant for applicants planning to participate in the **Medicine Degree Programme** (5<sup>th</sup> year; for an overview of the entire MedUni Vienna curriculum please refer to the following website: <https://www.meduniwien.ac.at/web/studierende/mein-studium/diplomstudium-humanmedizin/studienplan-studienplanfuehrer/>).

Curricular course modules open to incoming exchange students in the field of Medicine are:

- Emergency Medicine / Intensive Care
- Neurology
- Paediatrics
- Psychiatry
- Ophthalmology / Otorhinolaryngology
- Gynaecology / Obstetrics

In addition to curricular courses, incoming students can take elective courses according to their interest and timetable (for details see chapter below page 6).

Incoming Students in the field of **Dentistry** are invited to participate in the so-called "72-Wochenpraktikum" during their stay at MedUni Vienna. ## Course combinations

The table below shows the six possible combinations of the above-mentioned subjects in the field of Medicine.

Every applicant will be assigned to one “combo” (for details on how to indicate preferences please see chapter below). Combining courses of different combos / switching between combos is **not possible**.

Note that the following subjects **cannot be combined within one semester**:

- Neurology and Psychiatry
- Paediatrics and Gynaecology / Obstetrics
- Emergency Medicine and Ophthalmology/ Otorhinolaryngology

The subjects Ophthalmology and Otorhinolaryngology are held consecutively within the same course module, students can choose to participate in both or only one of those subjects.

## Indication of course preferences

Applicants should **check with the responsible person / coordinator at their home university** about their requirements and suggestions **BEFORE** entering their preferred program in Mobility Online.

Students who are planning to spend the **entire academic year** at MedUni Vienna will be assigned to one combo by the International Office (no indication of preferences required, as all course modules will be covered).

Students planning to spend **only one semester** at MedUni Vienna can indicate up to 3 preferences regarding the course combination (“combo”) which they would like to be assigned to. The MedUni Vienna International Office will try to assign them according to their first priority. Only if this is not possible, the second (and after, if applicable, the third) option indicated will be considered.

Generally, students are expected to attend all course modules of the “combo” they are assigned to.

**Only in exceptional cases** and if none of the course combinations listed above can be approved by the students' home institution, **one course module per semester** (1 out of 3) can be replaced by a clinical clerkship ("Famulatur" in German; standard duration 4 weeks; in exceptional cases clerkships of 2 weeks are possible).

For students whom this applies to, the MUW International Office will contact the hospital department(s) to enquire about their capacities.

In order to increase the chances of a successful assignment, students concerned need to indicate several options during the application.

As the decision on whether and when a department can offer clerkship places is entirely up to the department itself, the International Office therefore can't guarantee that places at a specific department will be available.

Note that some departments may also require a different level of German language proficiency (currently, the Divisions of Cardiology and Angiology require German C1; further details will be provided).

1,5 ECTS credits can be awarded per week of clinical clerkships. However, clinical clerkships don't entail exams and **no grade/mark** will be assigned.

## Interdisciplinary case conferences

Incoming students have the option to register for the so-called **Interdisciplinary Case Conferences**, which are held once per week (2,15 ECTS credits per semester, no grade/mark). A description of this seminar series is available [HERE](#) (only in German).

## Language of instruction

All curricular courses and exams are held **in German**. Exchange students are allowed to use a standard (i.e. non-medical) dictionary during exams.

## Additional clinical clerkships and elective courses

Students have the option to apply for **additional, self-organized clinical clerkships** ("Famulatur", 2 or 4 weeks, 1,5 ECTS credits per week, no grade/mark) **outside the teaching period** (during teaching breaks or after the teaching period has ended). If applicable, they have to contact the [university hospital departments](#) and/or [teaching hospitals](#) of MedUni Vienna **directly** to enquire about available places (a list of contact persons at MedUni Vienna departments will be shared via "Mobility Online").

Incoming students also can register individually for elective courses according to their interest and timetable. Details on elective course offerings will be published **shortly before the start of the respective semester** [HERE](#).

The International Office can't guarantee that places in specific elective courses will be available.

MedUni Vienna doesn't offer **language courses**. Students who would like to take language classes can refer e.g. to the offerings of the University of Vienna language center ("Sprachenzentrum"): <https://sprachenzentrum.univie.ac.at/en/>. In case the student's home university agrees, external (language) courses can be included in the Learning Agreement.

## ECTS credits and hours per course part

Most curricular courses of the 5<sup>th</sup> year contain three **course parts**:

- a) Lecture,
- b) Practical Course/Seminar,
- c) Clinical Practical Course.

Students cannot register for those three course elements separately, but only for the entire course module.

## Written examination for curricular courses (SIP5a)

MedUni Vienna does not require incoming students to take the written exam.

However, it is **necessary to pass the exam to receive the ECTS credits of the corresponding lecture**. Only students who have passed the written exam will obtain a grade/mark for the curricular course. One overall grade will be assigned for the entire course module (i.e. lecture, practical course/seminar and clinical practical course will not be graded separately).

In the context of the clinical practical course, students might be selected to participate in the so-called "Tertialüberprüfung" (oral check-up, participants are drawn by lot). Please note that this type of assessment does not qualify as a separate exam and does not substitute the SIP5a (details can be found [HERE](#)).

## Learning Agreement

Before submitting the actual Learning Agreement, students have to enter their course preferences in the application tool “Mobility Online” (by April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023).

In this context, **details of each course and/or clinical clerkship** of the planned semester program have to be indicated (course name, course code, ECTS credits). You can either enter the details manually -according to the list below- or select them from the menu at the bottom of the page (only clerkships and elective courses have to be entered manually in any case; see details on page 11/12).

\*\*\* students should check with their home university on the number of ECTS credits they might have to obtain in the context of elective courses.

Once a student’s program in Mobility Online has been confirmed by the MedUni Vienna International Office, it will later on serve as the basis for the final Learning Agreement.

Applicants / partner universities are invited to send us the Learning Agreement via EWP. If this is absolutely not possible due to technical restrictions, PDF documents will be accepted **provisionally**.

The Digital Learning Agreement has to be signed by the student and their home university before it is submitted to the MedUni Vienna International Office.

Only Learning Agreements (digitally) confirmed by all three parties are considered valid.

## Notes on application via Mobility Online

### General notes

Once you have logged in to Mobility Online, in the left hand side menu bar you will find the items

- a) Edit application
- b) My application data

You will also be able to change the language of the application menu (available in German/ English)

#### @ a) Edit application


- ➔ In order to enter your personal application data, please go to “edit application” and then to “forward to update”. Once you have updated the section please click on “back” to return to the application workflow and to complete the next steps.

#### @ b) My application Data

- ➔ Show application work-flow: overview of workflow steps. Steps that have been successfully completed are marked as “done” (green). In order to complete / update a step, please click on the link (blue box in column “direct access via following link”), and then on “forward to update”.

Note: **By April 30<sup>th</sup>** all steps (at least) until “Planned courses/clerkships entered” have to be completed!

- ➔ Download Documents: Option to download documents which are/might be relevant for your stay at MedUni Vienna.
- ➔ Select application: In case you have applied several times at MedUni Vienna (since 2020/21) you will be able to select the correct application here.



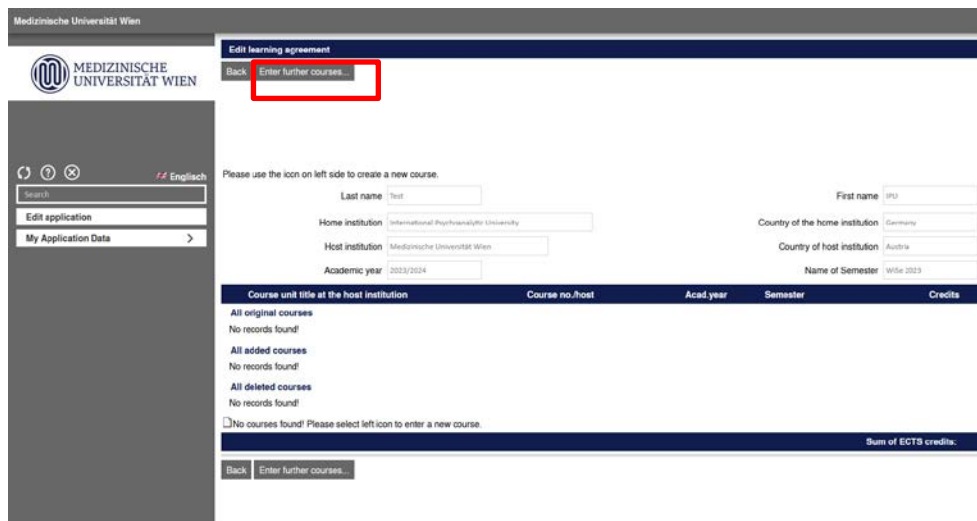

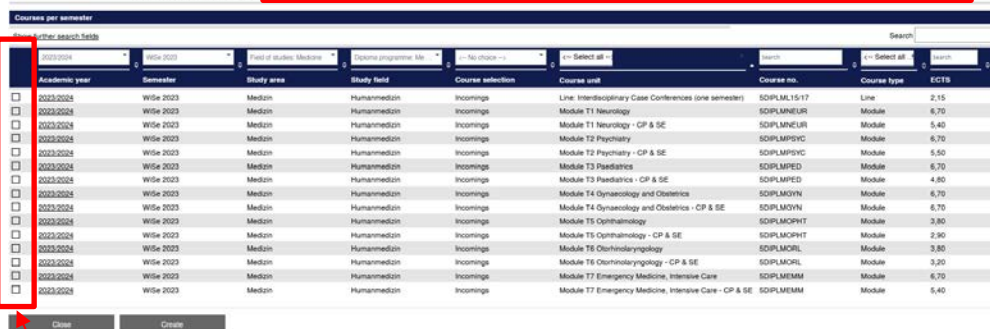
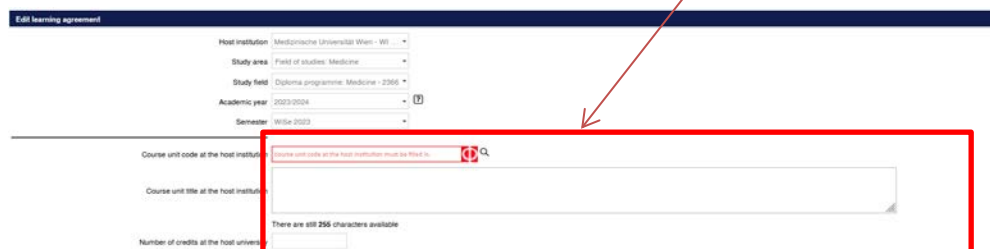
Mobility Online, you will be asked

In case you enter the courses manually, please make sure to stick to the details provided in the list [here](#). Please note that once you selected the course /entered it manually you will have to click on “create” to actually add the course to your program.
