



Announcement of a Professorship Position for Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at the Medical University of Vienna

The Medical University of Vienna (MedUni Vienna) with more than 6.500 employees and about 8.000 students is one of the largest academic medical schools in the EU area. At the **Department of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine** of the MedUni Vienna a **Full Professorship Position for Pediatric Hematology and Oncology** according to §98 university act 2002 is available, starting July 1st, 2024. We offer permanent employment according to the Austrian Employees act. The University Hospital for Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine is divided into five Clinical Divisions: 1) Division of Neonatology, Intensive Care Medicine and Neuropediatrics, 2) Division of Pediatric Pulmonology, Allergology and Endocrinology, 3) Division of Pediatric Nephrology and Gastroenterology, 4) Division of Pediatric Cardiology, and 5) Division of Pediatrics with special focus on Pediatric Hematology-Oncology / St. Anna Children's Hospital. The successful applicant will be head of the Division of Pediatrics with special focus on Pediatric Hematology-Oncology / St. Anna Children's Hospital as well as Medical Director of the St. Anna Children's Hospital, which is affiliated with the Vienna General Hospital - University Clinics.

The Division of Pediatrics with special focus on Pediatric Hematology-Oncology / St. Anna Children's Hospital has about 12,000 inpatient admissions per year, of which about 6,450 admissions are Hematology and Oncology and about 5,550 admissions are General Pediatrics of patients (age 0 to 18). In addition, St. Anna Children's Hospital has approximately 62,000 outpatient visits per year (General Pediatrics - and Hematology, Oncology and Immunology). This includes the areas of Hematology and Oncology including stem cell transplantation up to the highest level of care, the specialty areas gastroenterology, nephrology/urology, neuropediatrics, pulmonology/allergology, endocrinology/diabetes mellitus, rheumatology, immunology, hemostaseology and cardiology in level one and two, whereby St. Anna Children's Hospital works closely in coordination with Department of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, which is responsible for the highest care level 3 in these specialty areas. Finally, St. Anna Children's Hospital runs its own ENT department with an outpatient and an inpatient setting, whereby simple ENT interventions are also performed in a designated OR unit. The department is active in international research networks.

Employment requirements:

- Graduation in medicine with a subject specific doctorate or an equivalent foreign university degree
- Qualification as a specialist in pediatrics and adolescent medicine with the additive subject pediatric hematology and oncology or equivalent domestic and foreign authority
- Outstanding scientific qualification in the field of Pediatric hematology, oncology, immunology, stem cell transplantation and rare diseases with several years of experience in managing complex research programs
- Profound clinical qualification in the field of Pediatric hematology, oncology, immunology, stem cell transplantation and rare diseases.
- Successful and continuous acquisition of competitive third-party funds
- Leadership and management experience, including gender and diversity competence, and with qualification to manage a hospital department of the highest level of care
- Experience in interdisciplinary cooperation in clinic and research
- Educational and didactic qualification (evaluation results regarding teaching activities)
- International work experience

Expected from the applicant:

- Interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research in terms of promoting the research clusters described in the University's development plan especially Cancer Research/Oncology, Immunology/Allergology/ Infectiology/Inflammation and the Comprehensive Cancer Center and the Center for Rare and Undiagnosed Diseases
- Close cooperation with the core divisions of the department of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, Pediatric and Adolescent Surgery, Radiation Oncology, Orthopedic tumor surgery, Pathology and with and with St. Anna Children's Cancer Research
- Representation of the subject area in the medical curriculum aimed at integrative and practice oriented training
- Competence in employee leadership and motivation
- Continuation and optimization of the clinical services and procedures in cooperation with other disciplines and clinics as well as the management of the University Hospital Vienna
- Commitment to quality orientation and willingness to continuously enhance personal management skills

The MedUni Vienna aims to increase the proportion of women in executive positions and therefore expressly encourages qualified female candidates to apply. In case of equivalent qualifications, preference will be given to female applicants.
