To assist you in optimizing your thesis, thereby ensuring your work receives the best grades possible, we provide you with a thesis submission checklist. Please keep in mind that your reviewers will be sent an overview of what they should expect from dissertations generated within MedUni Wien, so that their grading will fall in line with the anticipated performance. While students (in agreement with their supervisors) may choose to deviate from the university guidelines (link), it will ultimately be the decision of the reviewers as to whether to reward students with the best marks possible should the submitted work not comply with the recommended outline.

	All subsequent pages prior to the beginning of the Introduction numbered with Roman
	numerals (ii, iii, iv)
	<b>Declaration</b> ; a prominent disclosure should be added regarding the use of any algorithms
	for translation, plagiarism prevention or improving the fluency and grammar of the text
	A List of Algorithms used should be added following the lists of figures and tables
	Chapter one: Introduction begins with page 1 in Arabic numeral, and ends with Aims of
	the thesis
	Any <b>Al-enhanced text</b> included in the thesis should be followed by a proper citation at the
	end of the paragraph, and cross referenced to the <b>Bibliography</b>
	Length of Introduction should be at least 30 pages. If you include a PDF of a published
	review, add 10 pages of novel text
	In Chapter two: Results, consider including a prologue that will prepare the reader for the
	first PDF. Between PDFs, insertion of <b>interludes</b> will allow readers to follow the rationale
	for extending the research in the chosen direction
	Manuscripts under review can be added as watermarked PDFs generated by the journal
	Do not add published <b>reviews</b> in this chapter
Ш	Obtain <b>publisher permission</b> for PDFs where necessary and place in the <b>Appendix</b> . If not
	necessary (open source), indicate as such.
	Chapter three: Discussion should extend from at least 10 to about 20 pages, including
	the Conclusion and future prospects
	Chapter four: Materials and methods. Most students nowadays get away with minimal M
	& M, by citing the relevant information from their published papers. If you nevertheless wish to add methods to your dissertation, do <b>not</b> simply copy/paste the text from information
	found in the public domain. Instead rewrite them in your own words
	The sections of <b>References</b> and <b>Appendix</b> should <b>not</b> be numerated as separate chapters.
	The Appendix can contain publisher permissions but also supplementary data normally not
	delegated to the main text
	The <b>References</b> should contain entries relating to <b>Al-enhanced texts</b>
	It is highly recommended to include a <b>CV</b> to inform the reviewers of your scientific
_	qualifications and output to date. However, this is not mandatory, and you may economize
	on personal information for reasons of data protection.
