Our environment

Challenges and opportunities in a changing world

Social change

The Medical University of Vienna is operating in a world that is defined by profound - and rapid - changes. Increased digitalisation, personalisation and mobility are making our society more and more complex. But these developments also open up opportunities, in particular through a diverse international environment formed by students and employees from various cultures. This diversity enriches the university by offering fresh perspectives, as well as promoting interdisciplinary knowledge transfer. At the same time, though, digital media are influencing social dialogue by amplifying divisive trends. However, improved access to information also lavs the foundations for more assured and informed decision-making – for students as well as patients.

Against the backdrop of this rapidly changing environment, the Medical University of Vienna sees it as its duty to offer guidance, provide sound, practice-based knowledge, and shape the future.

AI, precision medicine and digitalisation

Technological advances such as AI and Deep Medicine are transforming research and real-world medical practice alike. Precision medicine and personalised therapies are leading to better diagnosis and treatment, while digitalisation is facilitating more efficient communication and improved management of health data. However, in spite of the advantages, the related costs are frequently an obstacle to broad access to these technologies. At the Medical University of Vienna, we face the challenge of incorporating these developments into curriculums, research and clinical programmes, while maintaining a clear focus on the human element when it comes to patient care.



Challenges and opportunities in the health system

Demographic change and greater specialisation in medicine are making it more difficult to provide uniform access to medical care, above all due to the unequal distribution of doctors both in individual regions and in different specialist fields. In parallel, giving all patients access to innovative technologies is a major challenge. In such a complex environment it is vital that the university continuously refines its research and teaching, with a view to identifying practice-based, future-proof solutions. In view of our ageing population and the new medical needs that this gives rise to, the next generation will have to be trained with these requirements in mind, while also developing preventive approaches and integrating them more effectively into the health system.

Specialists and the competition for talent

The shortage of qualified specialists and increased financial competition with other scientific institutions serve as a source of motivation. Global competition in the medical sector requires innovative education program mes that take the latest trends into account – such as Al and digital medicine. In this context, it is vital that the Medical University of Vienna continuously improves its workplace environment and adapts its educational offerings. This is the only way to attract the brightest minds and retain them in the long term, while also enhancing the university's competitive position.

Geopolitical situation

Crises and conflicts have an impact on health systems and their funding. In the face of global instability, institutional resilience is key. In times of uncertainty, the Medical University of Vienna must consolidate its position as an agile, crisis-proof institution, and respond proactively to changes.

Climate change and health

Finally, climate change represents a growing challenge for health systems the world over. It is having a number of effects, including an increase in environmentally-induced diseases and the spread of new infections. This situation requires more in-depth scientific examination of the health-related consequences of climate change, as well as the adaptation of medical practice in line with shifting environmental conditions.




Starting now, what do we want to do to realise our vision?

An independent authority and point of contact for medical questions



How we aim to become one of Europe's top 10 medical schools






Research

In our research, we focus on selected specialisms in order to bundle knowledge and resources. In addition, it is important to us that we develop applications for research findings, and publish them in line with open science principles.

Teaching

Teaching at the Medical University of Vienna is based on modern, pioneering curriculums that ensure outstanding quality of education. This allows us to prepare our students for their future careers as effectively as possible. We place a particular emphasis on practice- and research-driven education. We support international student mobility, and our excellent degree programmes make us an attractive location for the best students. We also lay the foundations for lifelong learning by means of practically focused, postgraduate continuing education, technological innovations, as well as the development of new master's degrees and an MD/PhD programme.

This is hugely important, especially in the current age of digitalisation and the application of Al.

Science in dialogue with the public

The Medical University of Vienna has launched various initiatives designed to promote dialogue between research, medicine and society. In addition to sharing knowledge, the aim is to enhance health literacy on a wider scale as well as an understanding of medical topics in collaboration with the public. The university believes that its core function is to achieve scientific advances in dialogue with the general public, and to encourage its researchers to actively participate in this dialogue — through events, participative projects and new forms of scientific communication.
